WE HEAR GOD'S WORD

We Remember

Genesis 1:26-31, John 3:15-17, Acts 2:1-21 (The Inclusive Bible)

One: We remember with gratitude that God created us.

All: Then God said, 'Let us make humankind in our image, to be like us; and let them be stewards of the fish of the sea, and the birds of the air, the cattle, the wild animals, and everything that crawls on the ground.'

One: Humankind was created as God's reflection: in the divine image, God created them; female and male, God made them.

All: God blessed them, and God said, 'Bear fruit, increase your members and fill the earth – and be responsible for it! Watch over the fish of the sea birds of the air and all the living things on the earth.'

One: God then told them, 'Look! I give you every seed-bearing plant on the face of the earth, and every tree, whose fruit carries its seed inside itself; they shall be your food.

All: And to all the animals of the earth, and the birds of the air, and things that crawl on the ground, everything that has a living soul in it, I give all the green plants for food.'

One: So it was. God looked at all of this creation and proclaimed that this was good -- very good. Evening came and morning followed, the sixth day.

One: We remember that God sent Jesus into the world to bring us light and love.

All: Yes, God so loved the world as to give the Chosen One, that whoever believes may not die but have eternal life. God sent the Chosen One into the world not to condemn the world but that through the Chosen One the world might be saved.

One: We remember that God gave his Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

All: When the day of Pentecost arrived, they all met in one room. Suddenly they heard what sounded like a violent, rushing wind from heaven; the noise filled the entire house where they were sitting. Tongues of fire appeared to them and these separated and came to rest on the head of each one. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as she enabled them.

One: Now there were devout people living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled. But they were bewildered, to hear their native language being spoken. Amazed and astonished, they asked, 'Surely all the people who are speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears the words in our own native tongue? We are

Parthians, Medes, Elamites, people from Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya around Cyrene, as well as visitors from Rome, both Jews and converts to Judaism, Cretans and Arabs too. We hear them preaching, each in our own language, about the marvels of God.

All: All were amazed and disturbed. They asked each other, 'What does this mean?' But others said mockingly, 'They've drunk too much new wine.'

One: Then Peter stood up with the Eleven and addressed the crowd: 'Women and men of Judea, and all who live in Jerusalem, listen to what I have to say. These people are not drunk, as you think-- it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what Joel the prophet spoke of:

"In the days to come, it is our God who speaks, I will pour out my Spirit upon all humankind, your sons and your daughters will prophesy, your young people will see visions, and your elders will dream dreams.

Even upon the most insignificant of my people, both women and men,

I will pour out my Spirit in those days;
and they will prophesy.

And I will display wonders in the heavens above
and signs on the earth below,
blood, and fire, and billowing smoke.

The sun will be turned into darkness
and the moon will become blood,
before the coming of the great and glorious day of our God.

All who call upon the name of God will be saved."
