From the Pastor's Desk:

As winter winds blow, I am thinking about the glimpses we get of new life. In the coming days, we might see a crocus peeking out through the snow or the morning songs of birds heralding new beginnings. Before we know it, we will gather for Easter services and sing out our praises of God's resurrection promises. But first we need to prepare. Lent is the period of 40 days (not counting Sundays which offers a Sabbatical from Lenten practice) starting on Ash Wednesday until Holy Thursday.

The number 40 is important to the stories of our faith.

- The flood that destroyed the earth was brought on by 40 days and nights of rain.
- The Israelites spent 40 days in the wilderness before reaching the promised land.
- Moses fasted for 40 days before receiving the 10 Commandments at Mount Sinai.
- Jesus spent 40 days in the wilderness fasting in preparation for his ministry.

People often give things up for Lent as a way to symbolically unite ourselves to the mystery of Jesus' own temptation in the desert. It is also a time to reflect on your own priorities in your life, and to realign your will with God's own.

This year, I plan to reframe this idea. Instead of giving something up, I plan to start a new spiritual practice to reset my life.

My Lenten practice plan for this year is something I'm calling "the ToE of Lent." I plan to send a *Text of Encouragement* to someone each day from Ash Wednesday until Easter. I believe this will be an enriching and helpful way to enhance my prayer life.

If you want to do something new too, but are not sure ToE is the Lenten practice for you, here are some other ideas.

You can join Trinity in "40 things for 40 days," as you collect and donate 40 items of your gently used clothing to NESAP. We will bless our offerings on Easter.

You can start a prayer or gratitude journal. Or you can start walking or doing yoga. Spend 20 minutes in silence with God each morning (and get some exercise while you're at it). Maybe you can carve out time for Bible study (You can join one of the groups at church or study it at home).

Perhaps you can clean your house and donate things you don't need that could benefit others. Declutter and get rid of all the stuff that you don't really need. A cleaner space will not only help your mental health, but it will help you kick the habit of holding onto material things.

Whatever you choose to do, make sure it is something that will connect you to God and one another. Who wants to join me as we enter into a new time of spiritual growth? I look forward to hearing about your Lenten journeys!

Becoming an ONA Congregation

"Open & Affirming (ONA)" is the United Church of Christ's (UCC) designation for congregations, campus ministries, and other bodies in the UCC which make a public covenant of welcome into their full life and ministry to persons of all sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions.

On February 9th & 16th, the Trinity ONA team sponsored two after-worship lunch-Bible Studies with "Scriptural Lens on Becoming ONA." On the first Sunday of March, as part of our worship service, a panel of five people will share their experiences of becoming an ONA church. Since September, on the 3d Sunday of the month, Trinity Church members have shared with us personal "Moments of Affirmation," and why a "welcoming and affirming" church is personally important to them.

The process of discerning whether to become an ONA Covenant Church takes time – some churches take years for discernment. Before we at Trinity even consider taking a vote, all active members will be invited to complete a survey, in which you will be asked whether you would feel comfortable voting to adopt the following draft ONA covenant statement:

"Inspired by God's Grace, and United in the Holy Spirit and Christ's Love, we declare Trinity United Church of Christ to be an Open and Affirming (ONA) church. We invite people of every race, gender, ethnicity, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, age, marital status, economic circumstance, and physical and mental ability into the worship, rites & sacraments, fellowship, and leadership of our church. No matter who you are, or where you are on life's journey, you are welcome here." And, if you're NOT comfortable with saying "Yes," the survey will provide a space for you to write-in what questions or concerns you have, and what additional information you need, before you feel that you can vote "Yes" to becoming an ONA church.

This is all so that when the time comes to vote, the ONA taskforce will already know, from the survey and conversations, that at least 90% of active members will vote yes, the threshold for a church to qualify as an ONA church.

The ONA Taskforce is composed of Pastor Katie, Lucy Brady, MB Brainerd, Leslie Brooks, Tiffany Folk, Ashby Haines, Pam Marchand, Moriah Marr, and Hannah Matthews. We welcome your questions and appreciate each and everyone who participated in the February ONA bible studies!
